The Maryland Pumpkin Festival Recipe contest will be judged on Saturday, October 10, 2009 at Summers Farm.

Entries will be accepted from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, October 10.

Please bring finished product and completed entry form to the competition.

You are encouraged to pre-register, but you may also register from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, October 10 at the event.

Judging will begin at 1:30 p.m. Recipe participants will not be allowed in the judging area while judging is being conducted. Winners will be notified when prizes are awarded by the Judges on Saturday, October 10 at 3 p.m.

Contest Rules

- Each recipe must feature canned or fresh pumpkin.
- Each recipe must be original, and cannot be a copy of another chef's recipe.
- Only entries presented on disposable containers will be accepted. Exhibitor's name must be clearly marked on the bottom of the container and a copy of the submitted recipe must also be included.
- Entrants must provide enough of their entry to allow for three (3) judges to have a taste.

Entrants agree that Summers Farm has the right to republish the entered recipes and use pictures of the entries and entrants on their website.

Judges will select winners on the basis of excellence in flavor, texture, appearance, originality and effective use of pumpkin products.

The judge's decision is final.
